


Victorian Tea, Thursday, April 10

Heart Disease Quick Facts

Heart disease is very common. In the United States, heart disease is the leading cause of death for men, women, and people of most racial and ethnic groups. In 2002,1 in every 5 deaths was caused by heart disease.

High Blood Pressure Is A Leading Cause Of Heart Disease. Nearly half of U.S. adults have high blood pressure, which puts them at risk for heart disease and stroke. Just 1 in 4 people with high blood pressure has it under control.

Heart Disease Is Costly. All things considered, the cost was \$252.2 billion between 2019 and 2020.

What is heart disease?

The most common type of heart disease is coronary artery disease which affects the blood flow to the heart. Decreased blood flow can cause a heart attack.

Risk Factors

Overweight, physical inactivity, unhealthy eating, and smoking tobacco.

about how one family's grief was transformed into a lifesaving gift. While telling

this beautiful true-life story, Dr. Clarke expertly explores the history and

many-faceted topics of organ donation and transplantation.

We'll talk about the story and learn more about organ donation. For example,

- 103,223 men, women, and children are on the national transplant waiting list.
- 17 people die each day waiting for an organ transplant.
- 95 is the age of the oldest organ donator. There's no defined cutoff age for donating organs.
- 46,000+ transplants were performed in 2023.




